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## Challenge One: The letters game.

The challenge is to find the longest word that you can using the letters below. You can only use each letter once: (there is a 9 letter word in there)

## Challenge Two: The numbers game:

You can only use each number once. You can add them together, subtract them, multiply them or divide them. You have to try and make the target number. There are 3 different numbers to try and make:

Key Stage 1:

Key Stage 2:
